American Airlines operates the only daily direct flights between New York's JFK International Airport and Tokyo's Haneda Airport. Traveling from Haneda to downtown Tokyo takes just 30 minutes, compared to over two hours from Tokyo's Narita International Airport. ## ENJOY A CITY VIEW

When Justin Bieber hit Japan, he stayed at the exclusive Conrad Tokyo in the centrally located Shiodome district. For the best Japanese sushi in Tokyo, head to the Tsukiji Fish Market, where scores of tiny sushi bars prepare the freshest seafood available from the sprawling wholesale marketplace (tsukiji-market.or.jp). For more unique dining, follow in Katy Perry's footsteps to the Shibuya district and have dinner at Alcatraz + E.R., a prison- and hospital-themed restaurant with jail-cell booths and spooky live shows. ## SHOP TILL YOU DROP

Take a trip to Harajuku, Gwen Stefani's style inspiration. Finish up on Jingumae Street, where hot Japanese brands, including Shu Uemura and Journal Standard, stand opposite the Oriental Bazaar art and antiques store – a top spot for vintage kimonos.
